

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter presents the conclusions dealing with the results of the study discussed in the previous chapter. This chapter also contributes suggestions that can be used to gain better insight, particularly for students and lecturers of English Department of Faculty of Culture Studies and also future researches.

5.1 Conclusion

The writer makes conclusion related to the findings and discussion stated in the previous chapter. *Mudakrama* in Yogyakarta dialect has own pronunciation of vowels a, i, u, e, and o. Vowels occur in first syllable (initial position), second syllable (middle position), and third syllable (final middle position). It also occurs in the front, back and middle vowel. In this study the writer found sixteen front close, five front half close to close, six front half close, three front half close to half open, fifteen centre half open to half close, twenty seven centre half open to half open back, ten back close, three back close to half close, and nineteen back open vowel.

Some vowels occur in the initial, middle and final position of the syllable, for example / i: /, / eI /, / □ /, and / u: /. Vowels / I / and / U / occurs only in the middle position. While vowel / ε / in the initial and the middle position. Then vowel / ə / only in the initial middle position. And vowel / □ / only in the middle and final position

5.2 Suggestion

Based on the result of this study, the writer would like to propose suggestions which hopefully give certain valuable and useful contributions to both the future researcher and the students in improving the student's pronunciations about Javanese, especially in pronouncing Javanese vowels.

1. It is better for the students of English Department of Faculty of Culture

Studies especially who do not use *krama* as their daily language to know the correct pronunciation of Javanese *krama*. This can avoid misunderstanding when they use the language.

2. Future Researcher

The writer hopes that this research could help other researchers who want to continue this research dealing with language and society. This research would give information about Javanese and its dialect particularly dialects in Yogyakarta region. It could also become a reference in conducting similar study.

Finally the writer realizes that this study is far from satisfactory. The writer also hopes that other people would continue and complete or improve this study.
