## **ABSTRACT**

Exclusive breastfeeding is giving only breast milk to the baby and did not give the baby any other food or drink, including water, except medicines and vitamin or mineral drops. Breastmilk is also allowed, which is done until the baby is 6 months. There are many factors suspected to affect exclusive breastfeeding. This study aims to determine whether there is a corelation between age, education, work, family support, and Health Officer to exclusive breastfeeding. This type of research is observational analytic research with cross sectional approach. Data were taken, processed and observed coming from the questionnaire. The samples used are as many as 58 respondents. The analysis used are univariate, bivariate and multivariate correlation test and multiple logistic regression speraman. The research showed age (p = 0.033), education (p = 0.002), occupation (p = 0.000), family support (p = 0.000) and health workers (p = 0.000). While the analysis found the most influential multiariate are health workers.
