Lia : I'm sorry.

TFB : No, don't apologize.

TFB : So, had you heard about Amanda Todd before watching this?

Isaac : Yes, I've seen that video.

Adam : Mm-hmm.

Eric : I had heard about Amanda Todd.

Lia : No.

TFB : Do you know what happened to her after this was posted?

Eric : She killed herself, didn't she?

Victor : Yeah, she committed suicide.

Isaac : No.

TFB : She actually killed herself about a month after this video went up.

Isaac : Are you serious?

TFB : She ended up committing suicide.

TFB : And how does it make you feel hearing the story and knowing that that happened?

DJ : It's kind of speechless shocked.

Rumor : I feel like, she made two little mistakes, and that's not fair.

Victor : That type of stuff gets to me, and I'm not a very emotional person at all.

Isaac : She felt like her life was that bad to where she killed herself. You know, and... I wish I could just talk to her.

Adam : It makes me feel like crap. Like... everything bad I've ever done to people, like, everything bad I've ever said to somebody, it makes me feel like that really had a bad effect.

Alix : She's so Internet-famous now and whatever, yet other kids who have killed themselves for better reasons than that. Like... like no one gives a sh\*t about them, you know?

TFB : And what do you think of the guy that blackmailed her?

Rumor : I think he should go to jail. That's, like, child pornography.

Lia : He's a grown man. He shouldn't be picking on some teenage girl.

Alix : That's pretty f\*cked up, knowing that you killed some girl. How could you deal with that?

Madi : He should be arrested for the rest of his life.

TFB : And how do you think people that were tormenting her feel now that she's done this?

Isaac : I don't know. Because I never understood, why would they treat her like that in the first place?

Adam : I hope they feel really horrible. I hope they feel like this for the rest of their lives.

Adam : They have no repercussions for what they do on the Internet. They can say anything, and that's why people leave horrible comments on these videos. They feel like nothing bad is gonna happen to them. It's cause it doesn't.

TFB : And what do you think should happen to the people that would leave comments like this on people's pages?

Lia : There's not much to do, you know?

Tom : They should have, like, their accounts revoked.

Madi : They should just have their, like, comment box removed.

Victor : Something should happen to them, like some form of punishment, but the reality is nothing is gonna happen.

Alix : How are they gonna catch all those people? Kids find a way around everything.

Rachel : I think that these websites should be shut down. You can't blame them that this is happening. They have no control over it, but they're providing the resources to let it happen.

TFB : And what about the rest of what she went through how she had to keep transferring schools but the bullying followed her everywhere?

Isaac : Man, people are cruel.

Rumor : I feel so bad for her. I can't even imagine the feeling of not being able to escape something.

Eric : High school students, you know, they feel weak, so they pick on people weaker than them so they can at least, you know, have some power, and they find an easy target like someone who already has past problems, and they just, they make it worse without realizing that you know, that has very bad consequences.

TFB : So people said that she deserved some of what happened to her because of the choices that she made, what do you think about that?

Madi : Well, everyone makes mistakes.

Lia : All these like, mean-hearted people are over here like, "She deserved it." No, she didn't.

Rachel : You can justify what they're saying, but, at the same time, it's like, calm down. Just give the girl a little bit of, like, respect and decency.

Tom : She's just a kid. She doesn't really know any better. The whole point in life is you're gonna learn by messing up, and if she keeps messing up and you keep telling her, like, "Oh, you're never gonna get better," she's gonna start to think that life's never gonna get better.

TFB : At any point during her going through all of this, what do you think could've been done to help her?

Lia : She just really needed a friend.

Rumor : Somebody could've stood up for her. I would've stood up for her.

Adam : Her friends could not have abandoned her. Just accept the fact that they did it and be their friend again.

Victor : In school, they want you to talk to your teachers, the principal, your parents, but it's tough finding someone who can actually understand, because they're not going through it. You are.

TFB : Do you have any personal experience with being bullied or teased?

Tom : Yeah. In middle school, I, what, I was in theater. I was a theater kid. People would call it, like, "gay". Even if I was gay, which I'm not, but it's like, even if I was, how would my sexual orientation affect you in the slightest? Now that "gay" has become a slur, it's just another hateful thing that people can say to hurt a person, even though it really shouldn't be.

Eric : I've been made fun of in school for a lot of things, called "gay", "short", "stupid", "ugly".

DJ : Racist remarks sometimes. I used to be like, kinda overweight back then, and people used to, like, call me like, "fat" and stuff.

Alix : As a kid, like, I was really- I was just really trying to fit in so hard, because I didn't really have any friends. They saw that I was trying hard, and they just kinda... like, dismissed me. And then, because they did that, I started getting really mean to everyone.

Lia : It was around seventh and eighth grade. None of the boys would date me because, umm, they said I had the body of an eight-year-old little boy. And I laugh about it now because- I also cry about it too. But, I couldn't help it, you know? It's just... It's just mean how they would even say that. When I got to high school, stuff about boys didn't really matter, you know. But stuff online got a little bit worse. You're gonna have it, like, your whole life no matter what shape or form it is in.

Victor : I don't get picked on anymore, but then I see people who pick on other people, and at one point in my life, I also went through an amount of depression, and I managed to get through it. Seeing stuff like that, knowing that I've been through it at one point in my life, it really pisses me off.

Rachel : Karma will bite them in the ass one day, and it'll be awesome.

TFB : What do you do to keep yourself going and not letting it get you down?


